Kids grow up so quickly these days--we are often so busy that we wish we had a way to spend more quality one-on-one time together doing fun things. The Adventure Princess Program is a wonderful family experience and the perfect way to spend quality time with your daughters!



This program is designed to foster understanding and companionship between father and his child, and as this relationship grows stronger, to strive to be "Friends Forever." For the first 75 years, this program and its members focused activities around the Native American theme. Today the YMCA Adventure Princess Program promotes parent/child interaction while exploring the rich heritage of American culture. The Adventure Princess Program is designed for the father and daughter.

The families of each program are placed into neighborhood or school-based groups called Tribe Circles of generally five to eight other father/child pairs. Groups meet monthly as a local Tribe Circle in members' homes to enjoy a variety of activities including craft projects, games, story telling, singing, refreshments, as well as working together to plan special events.

Each Tribe Circle belongs to a "Nation" comprised of many other local groups. The Nation of each program hosts monthly major events such as an Induction Ceremony for new members, weekend camping trips, family picnics, hayrides, community volunteer work and many other fun adventurous outings. These events create positive learning experiences and priceless memories.
